Greetings Legion Family:

It has been a very busy spring 2022. Our post has participated in numerous Legion Family activities, and enjoyed the accomplishment of many goals.

The spring began with our Legion Riders participating in the Florida Department's annual month-long Round Robin competition in which Riders from all the districts in the state compete for points to aid the PROJECT: VetRelief efforts to turn the tide on Veteran suicide. All ride miles and PROJECT: VetRelief donation dollars count for points. I am proud to report that our own Mighty 5<sup>th</sup> District won the trophy for leading the state in points and fund raising for this worthy cause. It has been five years since the trophy resided in the 5<sup>th</sup> District.

Our Sons of the American Legion Squadron, in addition to exceeding its 100% membership goal, has continued to advance the progress of fielding a Junior Shooting Sports team. The range has been completed and all of the adult volunteers and coaches have been trained in the operation of American Legion shooting ranges and range commands, as well as the skills for the standing, kneeling, and prone competition shooting positions. The competition air rifles and required slings are in inventory and are sighted in. The Junior Shooters program is a local, state, and national competitive sport, designed to train youth on gun safety, marksmanship, and competition. Shooters that progress to the National Championship level will compete at the USA Shooting range facilities at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs. The program is open to area youth, regardless of Legion affiliation, ages 13 – 18. (19 if still in high school).

Our Legion Auxiliary continues to grow and support our Legion Family. They finished the year exceeding their 100% membership goal. This spring they ran a successful FSCJ H.O.P.E. drive that collected and donated non-perishable food items for Florida State College, Jacksonville's food pantry to help students with proper nourishment. Their current project involves creating *Boggy Bears* to help sponsor children with serious illnesses to attend **Camp Boggy Creek** in Eustis, FL and have some fun. (Camp Boggy Creek was founded by Paul Newman and Gen. Norman Schwarzkopf)

All of our family members have held elections for the new Legion fiscal year beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 to June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
